How to Answer Question 9: What Lists does the Passage Contain?

Listing is another way to make information memorable. Here's how to find and note this information when it's provided.

- 1. Read through the study passage again, looking for **three or more similar items**: nouns, verbs, statements, reactions, attributes, etc.
- Every time you find such a list, number each item on your Scripture-study sheet and note what
 the list contains (including the number of items) in the margin close to the first item,
 OR

Write out the list title and each item in your study journal.

Hints & Hacks

- Look for "easy" lists first. These are the *items the author separates with commas and labels* for you, like the 16 deeds of the flesh found in Galatians 5:19-21.
- Next, check your **summary** from Question 1: do you see **three or more similar items** that could be viewed as a list? Doing so in your notes will help you remember them.
- Look at your answers to Question 4 (locations), Question 6 (repeated topics), Question 7 (comparisons and contrasts), and Question 8 (special statements). These answers can also reveal lists.
- If I find *more than one list* in a passage, *I use different colors* for the labeling and numbering on my Scripture-study sheets.
